Mr. Woodward has worked in this area since his ordination in 1958, at Southwell. He became curate of Gedling, Nottingham after his ordination and in 1961 became Precentor of Leicester Cathedral and also taught at the Alderman Newton Schools. He was appointed vicar of Barrow in 1964.

The family - the vicar has 3 daughters and one son, will be living at Clare vicarage, a lovely old Tudor house with a large garden. The local town is delightful with a magnificent "Wool Church".

The family will be sorry to leave Barrow where they have many friends and have spent a very happy childhood.

Mr. Woodward's last Sunday at Barrow will be the 24th April and the family will move at the end of the month.

Rawlins Big Band pictured above treated some 200 local people to the big band sound on Wednesday 19th March in Rawlins Hall.

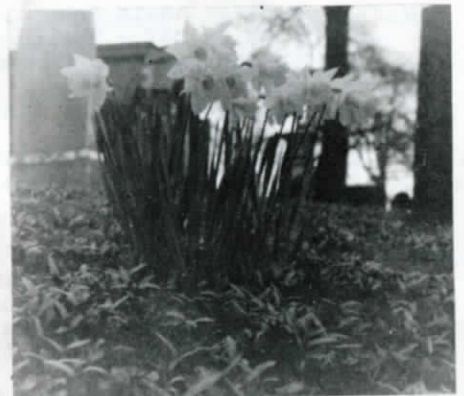
They played many of the old favourites - Hustle, Falling Feathers, Mango Walk and Midnight Rift.

## FLOOD MEMORIES

As a result of our request in the last issue we have the following recollections from Mr Jack Winterton with a little help from Mrs Betty Cryer.

In 1870 a man known locally as "Top-Hat" Brown was drowned in the yard of the White Horse. This was caused by the gate in the wall of the Farnham property near the Cross collapsing when a wave of water, thus released swept across the road and into the yard of the inn.

In 1921 the big flood took place on August Bank Holiday. It did not deter a character named Tommy Scott, who despite the handicap of a wooden leg, rode through the torrent on a bike.

In July 1932 the water swept right through the windows of the White Horse; and near to what is now known as "Harry Halford's Lodge" near Barrow, a bus with many passengers broke down, leaving passengers trapped. They had the harrowing experience of watching waters rise around them, and probably feared that the bus would overturn in the torrent. Eventually a party of students from Quorn Hall donned swimming gear and towed the stricken vehicle to safety.

## Nature Notes



The effects of the long dry summer are still with us. The ways of nature are really fantastic! The moss in our lawns was one of the first to feel the effects of the drought, and virtually disappeared. One would have thought that this year we would have had moss-free lawns - and yet there is more moss than ever. One can only conclude that the spores or seeds ripened earlier than usual and lay dormant on the ground until the warm September rains started new growth.

The same condition applied to the polyanthus, a plant that hardly ever seeds itself, the parent plant disappeared and tiny seedlings started to grow.

But perhaps the most striking example is beneath the two sycamore trees in Barrow Churchyard, see front page. There among the crocus and daffodils, are thousand upon thousand of tiny sycamore plants, none of which will ever have the chance to grow into a tree.
