The rain rather interfered with the enjoyment of the drive, but it was worth a lot to see, and to take part in the worship of, one of our most beautiful of English Cathedrals.

I hope to be away on holiday from September 1st to 15th. On the two Sundays during that time the services will be at 8-0, 11-0 and 6-30. They will be conducted by the Rev. D. J. Llewelyn, until recently Vicar of Beaufort, in the Diocese of Monmouth.
